For the week of March 14, 2022

Status

Thanks to the hard work and dedication of crew members, the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure re-opened Highway 1 and restored a major route connecting the Lower Mainland to B.C.'s Interior and the North.

With the highway now open, the ministry is focused on developing long-term solutions at impacted sites.

The frequency of these newsletters will be reduced to monthly while the Ministry is planning a long term solution.

Vehicle specifications

Oversize and overweight permit restrictions are in place for travel on Highway 1 between Hope and Spences Bridge.

Hwy 1 between Boston Bar and Lytton loads are limited to:

- Maximum overall width of 3.8m
- Weights as outlined in the [Commercial Transport Regulations](#) (overweight permits are not available)

Loads outside these dimensions are required to contact ppcpermit@gov.bc.ca

These restrictions are necessary to ensure the safety of all highway travellers as significant construction is ongoing. The restrictions will be reviewed once emergency repair work is complete. Vehicles transporting equipment to flood-impacted areas for emergency response purposes may be eligible for an exception to the above restrictions.

reduced speed limits

Status: Open
Anticipated delays: Minor delays due to construction
Changes: Two lanes open on existing bridge; updated
traffic signs; reduced speed limits



Gladwin Culvert

Status: Open
Changes: Return to normal operating conditions



Jackass Mountain

Status: Open
Anticipated delays: 45 minutes
Changes: Pilot-car for 4km; reduced speed limits
