


About the TNRD

The Region of BC's Best

Encompassing 44,449 square kilometres in the southern interior of BC, the Thompson-Nicola region is characterized by river valleys, desert terrain, rolling grasslands and towering mountains.

The region offers a range of rural and urban lifestyles, from the ranching communities in Lower Nicola to the convergence of the Fraser and Thompson Rivers in Lytton, from the wilderness of the North Thompson Valley to the hub of the City of Kamloops. It is home to more than 60 provincial parks, 12 regional libraries and Thompson Rivers University.

- Staff responsible for delivering the services and following policies set by the Board


All services are independent

Introduction - Committee Changes


- TNRD Board Committee Review June 2022
- Thompson Headwaters Services Committee dissolved
- Replaced with "broader public consultation process"

New EA "B" Engagement Process:

- Two (2) community meetings per year (Sept/Oct & Feb/Mar)
- Working groups (i.e. Blue River Trails & Blue River Tourism) Provide input to staff
- Website to share information and receive feedback
- Public surveys
- Direct communication always welcome (phone, email, coffee)

TNRD Emergency Program





- Local governments have specific emergency management powers – granted by the Province
- Issue evacuation alerts & orders
 - Evacuation decisions based on recommendations from on-the-ground agencies (i.e. BC wildfire)
- Primary role is safety of residents & support while evacuated
 - Work closely with Province (TNRD reimbursed for all eligible costs)

Get people out of harm's way and support them until they can return home




- Emergency Operations Center (EOC) activated during disasters
- TNRD staff work in EOC
- TNRD has one dedicated Emergency Program Coordinator who reports to the Manager of Community and Emergency Services






Following Disaster: Support recovery efforts

- Assist with Disaster Financial Assistance (DFA) process and other sources of assistance (i.e. Canadian Red Cross)
- Coordinate debris clean-up (when supported)
- Work with provincial agencies to protect properties (i.e. landslide risk, stream bank protection, etc.)

Garbage and Recycling Collection



Garbage and Recycling Collection

- Contract with BRID ending in Dec 31, 2022
- Due to operating boundary restrictions, BRID no longer able to provide the Electoral Area wide service
- Blue River Eco-Depot Operations contract (SCV Contractors) ends June 30, 2023
- Request For Proposal (RFP) will be issued looking for contractor to provide BOTH collection services and operated Eco-Depot
- Excellent local business opportunity!



Garbage and Recycling Collection

RFP Scope of Work:

- Garbage and recycling collection to all homes and businesses in EA "B"
- Provide all labour collection truck driver (3 days per week) and Eco-Depot attendant (4 days per week)
- Provide all equipment (Truck) TNRD truck available for purchase or supply other truck capable of tipping carts
- Not included:
 - Bin hauling from Eco-Depot (this will be part of region wide contract)
 - TNRD retain ownership of carts contractor will repair carts with parts provided by TNRD – replacement carts provided by TNRD



- Establish historical signage regarding Avola (funded with Trans Mountain Community Benefit monies)
- Remediation work to attic at Avola School House



Community Parks (and Trails)

Capital		Operational	TOTAL Budget
\$122,963	+	\$135,802	= \$258,495
		(\$52,652.80 transfer to capital reserve)	

2023 capital projects:

- Jetty repair
- Trails wayfinding signage & trailhead kiosks

Future capital project priorities:

- Blue River Trails Master Plan implementation
- Avola Community Park Planning
- Blue River Community Park Planning
- Park planning for improvements at the Murtle Rd Park when Trans Mountain leaves, i.e. Parking area, trails, disc golf
- Winter operation of the north portion of the Blue River Community park
- Brushing of luge hill and clearing for tobogganing



Radio Rebroadcast

Capital		Operational		TOTAL Budget
\$ 0.00	+	\$14,717.88	=	\$14,717.88
		(\$3,233.08 to capital reserve)		

- Need to repair/replace the shed at the Avola site
- Would like to move the Blue River equipment from the Trans Mountain Pumping Station to the Blue River Library, to take advantage of the TELUS fibre connection
